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#### **Meet the Band**

## **Biz Point**

Biz Point's eagerly anticipated debut show was raw, emotionally charged, and an absolute breath of fresh air. Biz Point is comprised of some of the most acclaimed musicians Anacortes has to offer and is the brainchild of Brian Tottenham, the current president of the Anacortes Music Project. His genuine passion and heart on his sleeve lyrics, to put it simply, were quite moving. I was fortunate to witness this awesome display of heart and musical prowess and am beyond excited to have the opportunity to chew the fat with Mr. Tottenham. If you don't know about the Tottenham stomp—you best ask somebody!

You all come from historic Anacortes musical royalty, how does this project feel different from current, or past music projects that you've been in? Has being in a band together previously (Enduro) lent itself to a fluid writing process or is this completely new and different?

This project is different for everyone because I have never really put my songs out there for these guys, or anyone really. Also, I asked Braydn [Krueger] to play bass because I knew he would approach it differently than I would and be just a little bit uncomfortable in a different roll. And for Jonn [Lundsford] and Bob [Vaux] it is different music than they are used to—lots of space. Bob can't recall being in a band where you could describe the music as "pretty". I think we are all out of our comfort zones just enough to create some really cool energy.

One of the main reasons I asked these guys to play was that I know what they do and have zero doubt that what they play will fit the song. And they know me. For the most part, I brought the songs in complete, but the band has freedom to play whatever they hear in the song and we rearrange as we go. Every one of the songs was instantly transformed into something more than even I knew was there. It's like I figured out the meaning to my own songs through that process.

Brian, it seems that you are the chief songwriter and vocalist for this project. That seems to be different than your role in Captain Fathom and Enduro—am I correct in thinking that? If so, has that been a smooth transition? Were there any insecurities you'd like to share? If so, how did you overcome them? It'd be great information for our young musicians out there. Definitely a different role! I've been in a band in one form or another since I was fifteen and have never once fronted a band. It has been amazing and really inspiring. It's been fun to go back to the guitar after being on bass for almost ten years in Enduro. I think the insecurities that kept me from this space are also what brought me here. The fear of connecting vs the fear of being alone. Fear can push you in one of two directions. You have to choose one eventually.

Also, instead of trying to write songs the way I wanted them to sound and never really getting there, I just wrote what came out and learned to trust that. Because those songs have always been in there, penned or being written.

#### What does Biz Point look like in the future? More gigs, an album?

More shows in the future. Not too often, but more. I have nothing of mine on vinyl, so an album is coming. Material wise we have a bit of work to do and I want some new stuff on there now that I know what we sound like.

Is this lineup solid or is this going to be something fluid with multiple members and rotating doors?

I would like to hold this lineup—they are in the band for a reason. However, I did build in some redundancy and I'm not locked into all or nothing. I like the idea that if it's one, two, three, or four of us, we could still put on a good show. Also open to the influence of others.

#### Favorite valley bands and why?

My favorite valley band is Mytslplk. "Rainbow Hair"? Was that the song? Jeremy is a genius and pure rock star. That band was probably my biggest influence coming from any valley band we played shows with. And I could listen to my daughter Pearl every second for the rest of my life and be just fine.

With each of you being such staples in the local music scene can you give me one story about your best show in the valley and why it stands out to you. We really do have a steady, flourishing music scene unlike most small towns. I thoroughly enjoy the perspectives from musicians who have been integral in the advancement of it.

So favorite shows are hard. Rexville shows in the Fathom days were always special. And currently any show that we get to look out and see our community soaking in what we are putting out is our favorite. It's interesting, Bob and Jonn are about ten years ahead of me. I knew their bands, Gravel, the Crabs, but I didn't know them. So we played shows together 25+ years ago, according to the posters, but we don't remember playing shows together.

Favorite random show, which Bob will echo, was the show at the Unknown during the most amazing thunderstorm. I played a set with Karl where the power was out but they ran an extension cord from the block that had power, and played the show by the light of a few light bulbs and lightning. Or that's what I remember... I love that stopping the show was not even an option. We seem to have a history of lighting shows.

The passing of the musical torch to each generation is so important. AMP is a huge part of that but I did want to give you guys a huge shout out for having Chance [Hansen] up to play guitar on your opener. You could see how much it truly meant to him and it was insanely cool to witness. Tell me what it meant to you and why you felt it might be important.

I try to do things from the heart and trust that. Chance and I were jamming one evening and it just felt like the thing to do. At first it was going to be just the two of us because the band had only run through the song maybe two times, but the boys felt confident enough to play it so we went full band. It meant the world to me because it meant something to Chance. It is important because Chance is important. It is important to make these experiences available and share what we all love and work so hard to be part of. We do our best to recognize all these kids for who they are—people—with just as much to offer and teach and say, right now, as our generations. He is also a damn good musician!!!

Musically and lyrically speaking, what story is Biz Point trying to relay to its listeners? What emotions do you hope to invoke? I can feel the rawness and intensity and was just curious if it had a specific message or themes you hope to convey.

The songs are all love songs—love and loss in one form or another. It's like a long, dark Canadian highway, miles and miles of trouble, grief, and shame, with hope on the horizon.
