Interview with Cover Artist Hunter Blakey

This month we're talking with local artist, Hunter Blakey. You can find more of Hunter's paintings, drawings, and digital art @pseudomantis on Instagram.

FOR YOU, WHAT IS THE BIGGEST DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DIGITAL ART AND MORE TRADITIONAL MEDIUMS? DO YOU HAVE A PREFERENCE?

I personally find digital to be quite difficult in the sense that I am inexperienced in the medium. The biggest difference personally is permanence. You can change aspects of the piece over and over again and not have any residue. Traditionally, if you put paint down it's not going anywhere once applied. I sometimes find myself trying to hit the undo button on my sketchbook.

Since I'm not familiar with digital it's kind of a search and find and there are infinite combinations and possibilities as to what textures and shapes you can make with one tool. Sometimes it can be overwhelming. I enjoy traditional art more because it's tangible and is something I am more familiar with. I like the feeling of pencil on paper. Traditional can be straightforward. I don't have to think for long about what series of buttons must be pushed to get it the way I want.

IS THERE ANYTHING YOU DISLIKE ABOUT BEING AN ARTIST?

There are many things I love and dislike about being an artist. Drawing can be therapeutic and explorative of myself. I also just find it fun. Creating and/or sharing art with others is a way to connect with people. But because it is so personal to me it can be emotionally draining. I have a hard time drawing for hours on end but I wish I could. I've also been told that art is not a career worth pursuing and that it makes little money. It's hard work, yes, but telling someone their interest is not worth their time is belittling.

WHAT PLACE DOES ART HAVE IN THE MODERN WORLD?

Art is everywhere and can take many forms. Some functional, some not. When I think of "modern" I think of technology and all of the artistic uses that people have found in it. Video games, art programs, electronic music, movies, digital animation, etc. Even logos and product design can be art. I don't think art will be going anywhere any time soon, it will just evolve and change.

He serenaded a nice sidewalk crowd from his shady perch in front of Pelican Bay Books. The procession then made its way to the piano in front of Johnny Picasso's, where Ben Starner deftly executed his magic.

Picking up more folks along the way, the parade took a turn behind Adrift to the trio formerly known as the Sleepy Lagoon, featuring some very nice vocal harmonies surfing on top of a three-guitar foundation. Down the block where Despairplane had set up, the evening turned electric. Their set was a heavier contrast to the opening performers and added sonic variety to the experience.

Before the sun could dip below the horizon, the faithful descended on Causland Park, where Kyle Miller and Channing Waage interwove vocals, violin, and guitar in the natural amphitheater.
